At St Thomas More we have a continuing responsibility to proactively manage and improve attendance across the school community and we believe outstanding attendance and punctuality to school is vital for your child to learn and achieve their best.

In order to monitor and analyse weekly attendance, we use a platform called Studybugs. If you haven't already, please get the free Studybugs app, or register on the Studybugs website, and use it to tell us whenever your child's ill and unable to attend school.

This efficient and secure system allows us to send automatic alerts directly to parents/carers when a child's attendance falls below the recommended threshold.

As you might already be aware, the acceptable level of attendance is over 95% and any child with less than 90% attendance is regarded by the Government as a 'Persistent Absentee'.

We of course understand that reasons such as illness and medical appointments, might not be within anyone's control. However, we do ask that medical appointment be scheduled outside school hours, and if this is not possible, please do provide medical proof in order for your child's absence to be authorised. It is important to note that even though your child's absence is authorised, their attendance will still be affected.

We would like to ask that you continue to support and encourage your child's good attendance and punctuality to school and not take your child away during term time as it will not be authorised, if this does occur your case will be referred to our attendance officer.

### <u>Upcoming Assessments – ATTENDANCE IS KEY!</u>

Year 6 have successfully completed their end of year assessments but please be aware there are other statutory tests coming up in other year groups, please see below:

03/06 – 07/06: Yr 2 end of key stage assessments AND Yr 4 Multiplication Check

10/06 – 14/06: Phonics Screening check Yr1 plus Yr 2 resits

Year groups 3-5 will also be having informal end of year assessments in June.

## Summer Uniform and PE Kit

It has been lovely to see the children coming to school smartly dressed and in correct uniform. We will once again be conducting a uniform check when we return to school so please ensure you are aware of correct summer uniform AND your child's PE days.


