If any additional trips are booked we will let you know as soon as possible



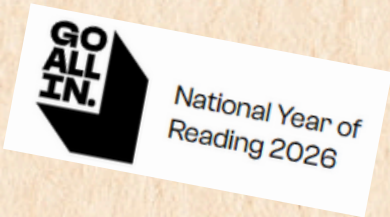
Excitement as Reception bake bread!

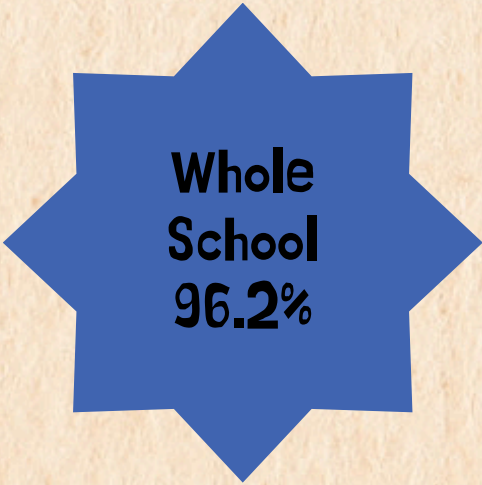
National Year of Reading
